Basics on the Texas Legislature

Meet every two years for 6 months.

This session ends June 2.

Bi-cameral government:

TX House: 150 members; 62 Ds, 88 Rs (District population = roughly 200,000)

TX Senate: 31 members, 11 Ds, 20 Rs (Districts population = roughly 1 million)*

Texas Republicans have a [trifecta](#) and a Republican [triplex](#): they control the offices of governor, secretary of state, attorney general, and both chambers of the state legislature.



**Note: Texas has 38 U.S. Congressional Districts (District Population = roughly 800,000)*

House Speaker's Race

Speaker **Dustin Burrows** (R-Lubbock) was the biggest offender of Texas Dems in 2023 with his “Death Star Bill” (HB 2127) attack on local control by municipalities. It’s still in litigation.

Nevertheless, Burrows won with these numbers by establishing subcommittees that he has apparently promised will include Democrats in leadership. Fine, but the maneuver threatens an unproductive session due to partisan poison between factions within the Texas GOP, known as “RINO hunters”.

House Committees should happen the week ending Feb. 14, Valentine’s Day. Will the Speaker find the love?

Gov. Greg Abbott's Emergency Priorities

Abbott 7 Emergency Items:

Advantage to “emergency items” legislation can pass in the first 60 days of the session without 80% support.

1. Cutting property taxes
2. A “generational investment” in the state’s water infrastructure**
3. Increasing teacher pay
4. Beefing up vocational career training programs for students after high school
5. Allowing the [use of public dollars for private education purposes](#),
6. Stiffening the state’s bail laws, and
7. Creating a cybersecurity hub in San Antonio.**

* Water – quality and quantity – has been an LIV issue from day one (2013). The Governor and Lt. Governor support another constitutional amendment for water funding, but exactly what the funds will be used for is an important question. We have always favored “conservation first, conveyance later.” Word is there are differences between the Speaker’s team on water and Charles Perry, longtime water ally of Lt. Gov. Patrick.

** The Governor has also called out these items as his priorities, but not emergencies: immigration, transgender, no DEI for “taxpayer dollars”.
